

- 1. Opening Prayer
- 2. Principal's Welcome Natalie Ingram
 - Reconnect to role and purpose of P&F. It aims to recognise and value the role that parents and carers play in the education of their children, and strengthen the partnership between family, school and parish. For the benefit of their children's overall development and learning. The P&F is voluntary and gives a parent's perspective and insights to the school.
 - The class parents are a separate role focusing on social events and commination between the parents of a year group.
 - Important that we interact with each other with respect as a group of volunteers.
 - Introduced Amanda as Parent Engagement Coordinator and her role.

 - Natalie will finish at St Kevins on 30 January 2025.

3. Colour Run Special Guest speaker – Dean- via phone linked into meeting

- School fun run have been around since 1987 and specialise in making fun runs easy to run and fun! They typically do 7/800 fun runs a year.
- Hayley will be our fundraising support manager
- To raise the most money engagement and building excitement before the event is key. E.g. sliming teachers when a certain \$ raised is reached.
- Everyone is involved in the event and has fun regardless of if they fund raise. For a small school like st kevins a 50-60% active participation rate is good. (larger schools can get around 80% participation)
- 2 main bits of work are:
 - o setting up the online fundraising account for the school via just giving, this is in the process of being set up (Adrienn liaising).
 - Volunteers for the day itself, around the course and to through colour. Course should be around 100-200m (15mins of running for the students) with colour stations every 40 meters.
- Mel has informed the council of the event. Mel has also reached out to Dee Why fire station, as we could add a water element to the day. (1 bottle of colour makes 40 litres of coloured water.)
- All supplies and advertising materials (posters, banners, capes, colours) are already at St Kevins, there are no upfront costs, with school colour run getting 40% of the proceeds. This model means no financial risk for St Kevin's and that colour run are incentivised to help facilitate a successful event.
- Ice blocks and slime have already been donated to the school for the event.

• The event will be at Walter Gors Park in Dee Why, the start for each year group will be staggered, children will be asked to wear old white/light clothes (for the colour to show up the best) parent are not expected to buy any new clothes for the event.



4. President's Welcome and Introductions – Tami Griffiths

- Thanks to all the parents and friends who always lend a helping hand to the school and are supportive with events, Tami will stay on as president to the end of the year.
- a. Planning and communications
 - Facebook and social media platforms for the P&F have been removed so that all
 communications are now through the school's social media account, to keep things
 simple.
 - We ask that all key communications be through the P&F email address <u>stkdy.pf@gmail.com</u> WhatsApp groups for class parents are to be used for P&F specific communications.

- Prior to each P&F meeting parents will be asked for their input to the agenda via the class parent network. Agendas will be circulated a week before the meeting.
- Sign up will be used to allocate volunteer jobs for events.
- The school website has all the information you need to read up on the P&F roles.

b. Vacancies in P&F team

5. Catholic Schools Parents Report

• The role is still open to volunteers, 1 meeting per term all online. The role acts as a link between the parents and how the church runs the schools across the diocese.

6. Treasurer's Report – Adrienn Sweeney

- The P&F started the year with \$1600 (lowest funds at the start of the year ever)
- Lunch fox has made approx. \$600 so far this year with the 5% commission received by the school.
- Mother's Day stall and breakfast ran to costs, with a net \$80 proceeds from the events. And approx. \$200 of stock left over for next year.
- Father's Day gifts were purchased at a cost of \$1300

7. Parent Engagement Coordinator – Amanda Kew

- Amanda introduced herself as the new parent engagement coordinator across St Kevins and St Johns. This is a new role on the beaches engaging parents with the school and parish.
- Amanda has enjoyed her time in the role so far and has run one afternoon tea for year 2 parents and will arrange these for all years of the school. As part of the role Amanda will also be assisting transitioning new families.
- Amanda recently has a tour of St Kevin's church and would like to arrange tours for parents as it gave a great insight to the church, she's also looking at setting up a working bee for the kindy play space.

8. Link to Learning – Natalie Ingram

- a. NAPLAN what is it, why is it done? Where it sits within the assessments in a school year?
 - The National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) for students in years 3,5,7 and 9.
 - 4 parts 3 literacy and 1 numeracy, the tests are tailored (adaptive) which means the online test with presents questions that are more or less difficult depending on a student's response.
 - Allows parents to see how their child is progressing against a national standard.
 - Provides schools and education systems with information about how education programs are working.
 - NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. Teachers use the results and other pieces of evidence to help individual students with their learning.
 - The school uses the results to identify strengths and areas that need improved teaching programs.
